PBC Legal & Consultancy Services is inviting submissions from culturally knowledgeable Yugunga-Nya people or businesses, whose expertise is crucial in developing and facilitating Cultural Awareness Training for Sandfire Resources.

The Cultural Awareness Training is requested by Sandfire Resources to increase employee, contractor and director knowledge, understanding and appreciation of Yugunga-Nya's history, culture, achievements and opportunities. In particular, Sandfire Resources would like all Australian employees, relevant contractors and directors to understand the significance of Yugunga-Nya culture, particularly, the importance of sites of significance at Sandfire's DeGrussa mine site.

The training will be provided to all Australian Sandfire employees (approximately 100) and their seven Directors. Cath Bozanich, Chief Sustainability Officer at Sandfire Resources, will coordinate the training plans, content, and logistics with support from PBC Legal & Consultancy Services.

The training is anticipated to be conducted over many sessions to ensure that all Australian employees, relevant contractors, and directors are included. While open to all training styles, the training must consist of components for on-country visits to sites of significance at the DeGrussa mine site, as well as options for self-paced online learning or in-house presentations.
